

(Counties with Poverty Rates At Least 1.5 Times the U.S. Average)





County Economic Status 2023






- Special program for coal-impacted communities
- \$65 million available in 2023
- Grants of up to \$1.5 million (\$2.5 million for broadband)
- Application deadline April 19
- www.arc.gov/POWER



- \$368.1 million in 449 projects touching 360 counties
- Projected to --
 - create or retain more than 39,600 jobs
 - leverage more than \$1.57
 billion in additional private investment
 - prepare over 100,000 workers and students for opportunities in entrepreneurship, broadband development, tourism, and other industry sectors


ARC POWER INITIATIVE PROJECTS PER COUNTY CUMULATIVE THROUGH DECEMBER 2022







- Building and strengthening local recovery ecosystems
- \$13 million available in 2023
- Grants of up to \$500,000
- 64 applications seeking ~\$21 million
- www.arc.gov/INSPIRE







- Special emphasis on multistate activities
- Must involve activities and partners in at least two states
- Grants of up to \$10 million for implementation and \$500,000 for planning
- 4-page concept paper is required
- Rolling application process
- Priority for projects that have the potential to transform the local economy
- Applicants must contact the ARC offices in the states to be covered by the grant prior to submitting concept paper
