

Initial Investment: \$70,000

GOAL: INFRASTRUCTURE - All county residents should have viable broadband connection options Strategy: Guarantee all activity by ISPs related to the State's Residential Broadband Expansion Grant program, RDOF, ARC or any other funding sources is undertaken and completed

Strategy: Bring broadband connections to areas not covered by the state's grant program

Strategy: Continued advocacy with future broadband funding opportunities

Strategy: Continue providing advice and guidance to local officials on broadband issues

GOAL: **AFFORDABILITY** ---Economic barriers should no longer prohibit community members from accessing the broadband network.

Strategy: Increase awareness of, and applications to the Emergency Broadband Benefit / Affordable Connectivity Program

Strategy: Identify other sources of funding outside of the Affordable Connectivity Program to help low-income and other residents of the county have access to a broadband connection

Strategy: Continue the development of positive working relationships with ISPs operating in the county

Strategy: Increase access to affordable devices

GOAL: DIGITAL INCLUSION/ LITERACY -- All county residents can successfully and effectively utilize the broadband network for work, leisure, health, and social services.

Strategy: Assess the digital inclusion resources already available in the community

Strategy: Develop specific strategy for the county to become a Digital Ready Community

Strategy: Provide educational support to community members on basic broadband connection skills

Strategy: Development of a one-stop online presence for broadband issues for the community

Strategy: Support workforce development efforts in the county and region

Strategy: Support community-led remote work development

GOAL: ADVOCACY-

Ensure the awareness of the broadband issues facing Athens County continue to get the attention of local, state, and federal leaders. Furthermore, ensure that the local community has a high level of awareness regarding the broadband initiatives that are ongoing.

Strategy: Provide continued advocacy on the broadband challenges facing Athens

Strategy: Promote a "Re-imagined Athens."

Strategy: Develop an Athens County Broadband Navigator Website

PROGRESS TO DATE

Digital Navigator Grant - A \$388,954 grant from the NDIA (National Digital Inclusion Alliance), through Google.org to hire a Digital Navigator who will help close the digital divide through repeated interactions with individuals.

Amesville Broadband Project. This project is funded by the ARC (Appalachian Regional Commission) and the Athens County Commissioners for a total of \$966,320 to bring broadband internet access to the Village of Amesville.

Promotion of the ACP (Affordable Connectivity Program) to help eligible individuals sign up for the program to save up to \$30 off a month on their internet bill. *11,086 Athens County subscribers to date.*

Negotiated and executed an agreement with PCs for People. This is a non-profit organization that provides low-cost internet devices and hot-spots to those in need. Up to \$60,000 can be used to distribute roughly 300 laptops as part of the NDIA grant.

Launched a comprehensive Business Survey that will help us advocate for businesses and build an effective strategy to develop the network that Athens County needs.

Developed content and working towards funding for an all-encompassing website that details Athens County broadband infrastructure and digital inclusion efforts.
